Bangor Area Comprehensive Transportation System (BACTS), the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for the greater Bangor urbanized area (UZA), is committed to ensuring that no person is excluded from participation in, denied the benefits of, or otherwise subjected to discrimination under any BACTS program or activity on the grounds of race, color, national origin, income, gender, age, disability, or limited English proficiency. BACTS requires any contractor or consultant performing work on behalf of BACTS to certify that they will not participate, directly or indirectly, in any type of prohibited discrimination, and acknowledge they are subject to sanctions for non-compliance.

Fiscal Year 2022 Accomplishments

BACTS provides inclusive access to, and encourages participation, throughout the metropolitan planning process. Notice of all public meetings, comment periods, planning documents, studies, and meeting agendas are posted on the BACTS website (www.bactsmpo.org). All of BACTS’ committee meetings are open to the public and allow opportunity for public input. The [BACTS Public Participation Plan](#) details the procedure which BACTS follows to provide information and comment periods for the specific plans and programs which BACTS produces.

All plans and programs developed by BACTS include the Title VI Policy Statement. Public comments received on plans and programs, and response to those comments, and details of other relevant public involvement activities are incorporated into the final plan or program documents.

BACTS staff either facilitates or actively participates in public meetings for the development of metropolitan transportation plans, programs, or studies, as well as transportation construction projects of regional significance, whether hosted by BACTS, MaineDOT, or the members. BACTS staff also serves as a technical resource to local transportation-related advocacy groups, and the general public. During the course of the year, advisory committees or workgroups were formed for various studies. These committees promoted full participation and representation from affected populations.

BACTS updates the website periodically to create a more user-friendly and streamlined appearance to the public. BACTS also increased social media presence through Facebook posts, Linked-in, and the development of a YouTube channel.
